Google classroom



What is Google Classroom?

Google classroom is a virtual learning platform which we will be using as your child's digital link to learning.

Teachers will be able to use Google Classroom to share work, homework and much more with the children and parents/carers.

Please note that Early Years will continue to also use their Tapestry online learning journal alongside Google Classroom.

Google Classroom can be accessed anywhere, at any time and from any device including;



Downloading the Google App will allow you to edit Google Assignments (work) from any device that is connected to the internet. However, you can also access Google Classroom via the internet using www.classroom.google.com. If you do not have a device at home that you can access Google Classroom via, please contact the class teacher.

Getting started

Each child has been provided with a secure login and password that is unique to them. This information will be provided to you by their class teacher. If for any reason you have not received this or it is lost, please contact your child's class teacher.

Logging in to Google Classroom

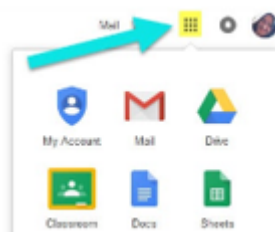
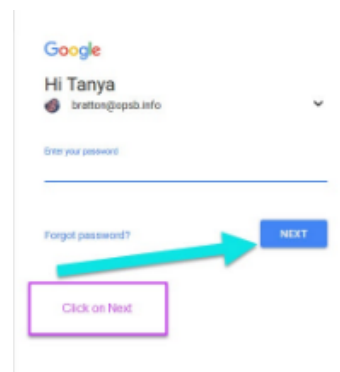


1. Click on the Google Chrome browser icon.

2. Type www.classroom.google.com into your web address bar.
3. Click on **SIGN IN** in the upper right hand corner of the browser window.



4. Type in your child's **Google Email address** provided by the school and click "next."
5. Type in your **PASSWORD**, provided by the school and click "next."
6. This will take you to the Google Suite. If you click on the 9 squares (Waffle/Rubik's Cube) icon in the top right hand corner to see the Google Suite of Products.

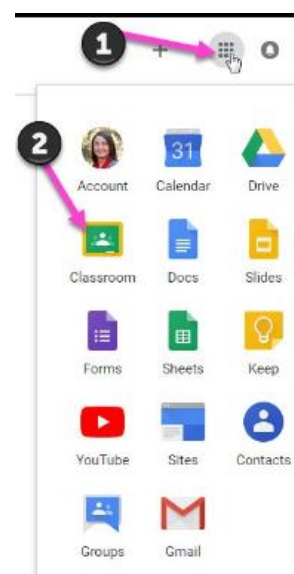


Joining the class in Google Classroom.

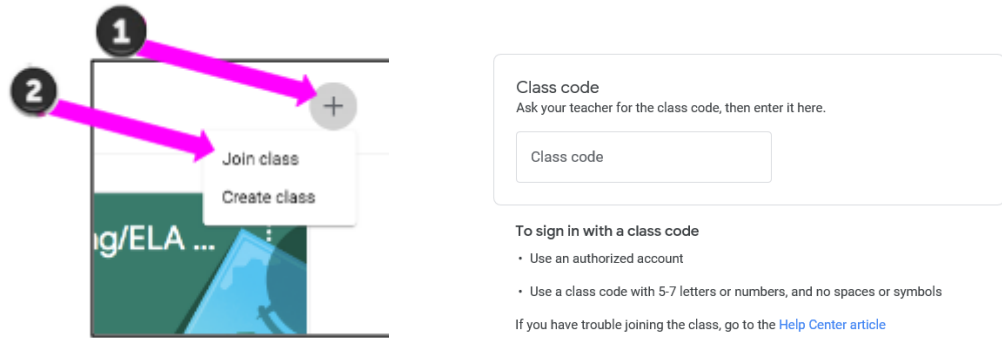
Please note that children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 have already joined their class in school so you can move to 'Navigating Google Classroom' on the next page.

For children in Early Years, Year 1 and Year 2, please continue to follow the steps below.

1. Click on the waffle button and then the Google Classroom icon.



2. Click on the “+” to join a class. Type in the class code given by your teacher on the letter from school.



3. Click on the class you wish to view.

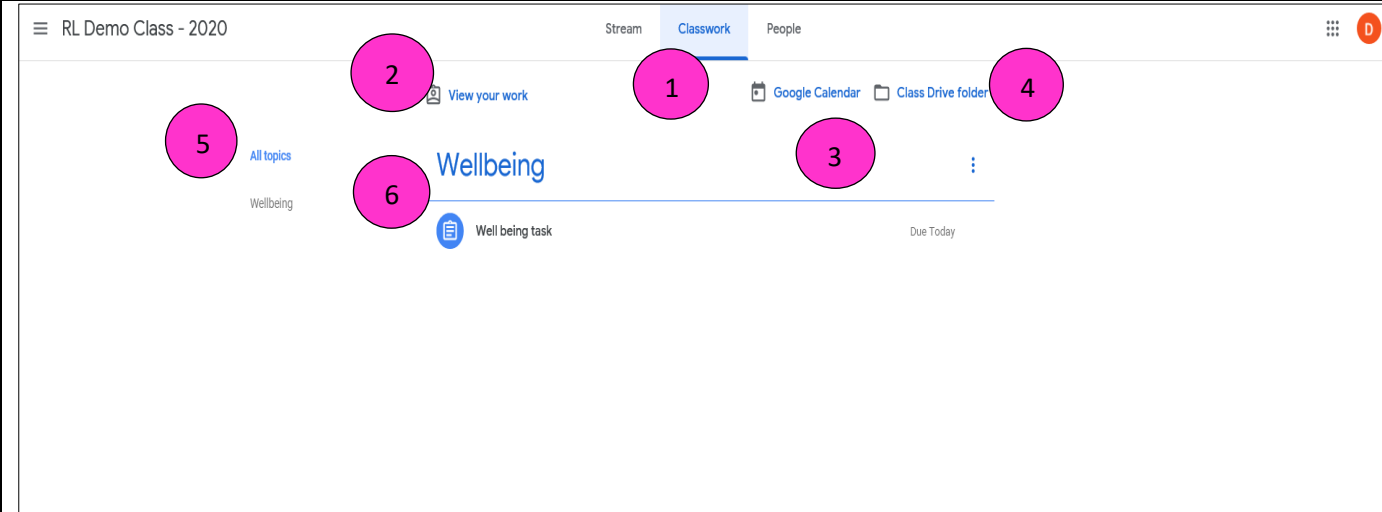
Navigating Google Classroom
