


























## Year 4 Spring Term 2

 horizon line	the point where the sky meets the land or water	 texture	how layers of sound within a piece of music interact	 conservation	the act of protecting Earth's natural resources—like water, air, soil, forests, and wildlife—to keep them healthy and prevent them from being wasted or destroyed	 batter	 aim
 perspective	flat, 2D drawings look 3D by showing depth, distance, and how objects appear smaller as they move farther away.	 structure	the organization of a song, determining the order of sections like verses and choruses to give it shape.	 deforestation	the large-scale cutting or burning of forests by humans to create farmland, ranches, or cities, or to use wood for products like paper	 bowler	 bounce
 vanishing point	a spot on the horizon line in a drawing where parallel lines (like train tracks or road edges) appear to meet and disappear into the distance.	 rhythm	a repeating pattern of long and short sounds or movements, often described as the "way the words go" in a song or the beat you clap to	 habitat	the natural home or environment where a plant or animal lives, grows, and thrives	 stump	 swing
 impressionism	a 19th-century art style where painters used quick, small brushstrokes to capture a fleeting "impression" of light, color, and movement in everyday life	 tempo	the speed of music, or how fast or slow the beat goes	 endangered	a species at very high risk of disappearing forever, meaning they could become extinct
