


Part 2: Strategies for reducing risk and promoting safe behaviour



There are 2 ways of dealing with this...

Restriction ACCESS P **OurPact** Search to Find Places To see a list of places near you, turn on Location Services in your Allow "Facebook" to access your location while you use the app? Facebook uses this to help people



Education





The best resilience is a good parental/carer relationship

- Stay engaged- ask and find out about what they like doing online
- Have regular conversations, ask open questions
- Ask them for help can they show you how to do something better online?
- Agree reasonable ground rules around device use/screen time etc (see family agreement)
- Do they know where to go for help if they experience something upsetting?

Talk to the Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) at school
